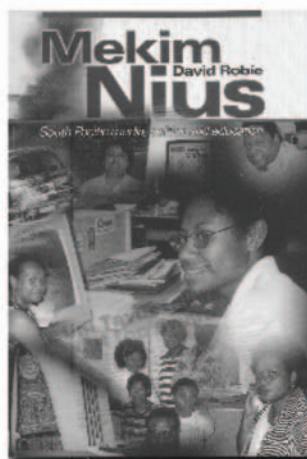




“COUPS, POLITICS AND THE PACIFIC MEDIA”
